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INTRODUCTION.

THERE ought always to be a reason for a new volume. Every book ought to have a mission, and ought to contain something which will be helpful to those to whom it offers itself.

This little book meets this requirement. It reaches out a helping hand to the thousands of Christian Endeavor societies which are filling the country with their inspiring influence. It has been noticed that more members rise to testify than to offer prayer. The writer has been in meetings in which twenty or thirty persons took part, though there were but two or three prayers. No doubt many find it easier to speak than to lead in prayer. The design of this book is to aid young people in this important part of the services.

The prayers which are found here are not intended to be read from the book, or to be used in precisely the words in which they are given; but it is thought that they will be helpful to very many who are not accustomed to pray in public, by suggesting to

them suitable forms. Nearly all of these prayers have been written expressly for this volume, mostly by those who are themselves active in Christian Endeavor work.

The preparation of the book has been a service of love, wrought in Christ's name. The writer of this Introduction commends the volume as a valuable addition to the list of helps for those who are in training for Christian work.

The prayers cover many different objects. Perhaps the best way to get help from the book will be to select, before the meeting, the form of prayer which seems to contain requests most in harmony with the theme of the service, and to study it so as to become familiar enough with its expressions to be guided by them in praying publicly. We ought to learn to take our part in public service intelligently, and without hesitation or stumbling. It is believed that a proper use of these forms will be of much help in this direction. For such use the book is earnestly commended.
